Unfinished Business None presented.

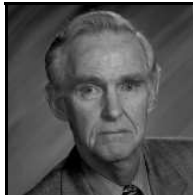
Members Ill or in Distress Chief Maddox's mother has passed away and the father of Chiefs Tim and John Kalavsky passed away also.
