MEETING MINUTES

NOVEMBER 18, 2010

HOLIDAY INN

The General Membership meeting of the Cuyahoga County Police Chiefs Association was called to order at 1210 hours by Vice-President McQuaid.

Roll Call Chief Baumgart led the Pledge of Allegiance and the Invocation. Secretary-Treasurer Lipton called the roll of officers. President Maddox and Governor Loftus were excused. Members and guests introduced themselves.

Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes *A motion to accept the minutes of the regular membership meeting of October 21, 2010. as distributed, was made by Chief Baumgart and seconded by Chief LaGatta. Motion Passed.*

Financial Report Secretary Treasurer Lipton reported that our account balances are as follows:

A Motion to accept the Financial Report was made by Chief Wright and seconded by Chief Harris. Motion Passed.

Executive Director's Report Bob Bruckner reported as follows:

- **2010 Membership Roster** has been distributed via e-mail. It was originally rejected by a number of e-mail servers due to its

size. It was e-mailed again in two parts and has also been posted on our website.

- **The December 16th meeting** will be held at Tri-C, Corporate College East. Reservations will be required.

Legal update Steve Parisi

- Steve cautioned again that a written policy concerning the use of Tasers is required to effectively defend against lawsuits resulting from their use.
- A Madison County judge recently suppressed the results of an Intoxalyzer 800 test because the officer did not perform the required second test to verify the result of the first test.
- The U.S. 6th Circuit Court of Appeals has ruled that the statement of a domestic violence victim would be admissible in court even without the victims testimony because the statement fell under an exception because it was given during an emergency while the suspect was still at large.
- The U.S. Supreme Court has ruled that people convicted of possessing a gun while selling drugs are subject to a 5-year mandatory minimum sentence on top of most other sentences.
- Columbus v. Kambi, 159 Ohio Misc.2d 14, 2010-Ohio-4260. Outlines the procedures for courts to take judicial notice on laser speed detectors.
- State v. Wilburn, 188 Ohio App.3d 384, 2010-Ohio-3536.

Once a traffic citation is issued and the purpose of the original stop is completed, the lawful basis for the detention ceases. If police thereafter seek consent to search the vehicle absent some reasonable, articulable suspicion of criminal activity other than the traffic violation, the continued detention is unlawful.

- More than 340,000 palm prints have recently been added to BCI's AFIS database.

Speakers for Today's Meeting

- **Shari Ma, Program Officer, Cuyahoga County Department of Justice Affairs** spoke concerning Guidelines for the Incarceration of Juveniles. Due to Federal compliance guidelines, she will monitor all jails and physically check each facility once every three years to ensure juvenile incarceration policy compliance. This is in addition to the regular State jail inspections.
- **Ms. Chava Berkman, Mental Health Services, Inc.** provided information on the Violence Loss Response Team. This Federally funded program currently provides extensive services to families of homicide victims through a partnership with Cleveland PD Homicide Unit and the County Witness/Victim Service Center. The Team will respond 24/7 at no cost and is looking to expand to all of Cuyahoga County. Call 216-623-6888 for additional information.

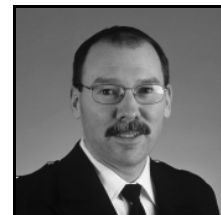
